# From Steve Cosier, District Council

Another busy month for me as your District Councillor. At the beginning of June, I was informed by WODC officers of hazardous waste being dumped at in Standlake. The waste contained several hundred unstable lithium-ion batteries stored within chemical hazard drums used for storing a chemical known as Isocyanate. This incident was dealt professionally before, any negative affects to environment or public. WODC officers liaised between Ubico and hazardous waste specialist Cawleys, as well as the fire dept, Environmental Agency and surrounding districts, and the offending waste was disposed of. WODC are going to be implementing directed surveillance at identified hotspots across the district to combat this issue and I can inform you directly if we undertake any such surveillance within your ward.

As part of the Rural Crime Partnership Cameras have been installed throughout rural locations in West Oxfordshire to combat fly-tipping. £156,000 in funding has been secured from the Police and Crime Commissioner for Thames Valley and the Home Office's Safer Streets initiative and will be used to tackle fly-tipping and other rural crimes. This area of work will be led by the West Oxfordshire, South Oxfordshire, and Vale of White Horse district councils and Thames Valley Police. New covert cameras, purchased with funding from the scheme, will be deployed in fly-tipping hotspots across local rural

areas. Currently West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) shares four cameras with a neighbouring council, but through this project, a further 20 cameras were bought for WODC use along with additional cameras for South and Vale.

Finally, last month, I had the absolute pleasure of being invited to play football for the local Dad's Stanton Harcourt Team in the local derby against Standlake. Though not in the same league as Mary Earps or Jordan Pickford, I absolutely enjoyed my time playing in goal. It was a friendly and well-played match with Stanton Harcourt eventually winning 5 goals to 2.


