The Old Guardroom

If you're looking for a room to hire in the village, The Old Guardroom on the Old Airfield development is the ideal venue.

The facility is suitable for business meetings, small social gatherings (receptions, memorials, parties etc), taught lessons (Yoga, ballet, art classes etc). It comprises of one large open area (54 m2) with patio doors that open out on to a large, enclosed garden with seating. There is a small kitchenette and a toilet. Maximum capacity 108 people. Seating and tables provided for 30. There is a small car park for approximately 10 cars adjacent to the building. See our welcome book for more details. Hire charges:

- Regular Bookings Village Societies e.g., Drama Club, Book Club etc £5 per hour.
- Taught classes e.g., dance, yoga, bounce, art class etc. £10 per hour
- Casual bookings in the day and Sunday to Thursday evenings (until 6pm) £10 per hour
- After 6pm Friday and Saturday £14 per hour
- Special occasions where the facility is required in the day and evening (per 24 hours) e.g.
- A Wedding or special occasion related to a Stanton Harcourt or Sutton resident £100

Monthly Report October 2024 from West Oxford District Councillor Steve Cosier (SASH) Dear residents.

I hope you are well. Just a few pieces of information for you.

<u>Pension credits and housing benefit – winter fuel bills</u> Since the Government's changes to Winter Fuel Payment eligibility rules, I have been asked by local SASH pensioners how they might access information regarding pension credits and housing benefit to help them with the payment of winter fuel bills.

On their behalf, I have contacted Democratic Services (WODC) who have explained that the Customer Services team (WODC) have a signposting message to put any caller in touch with housing team to discuss pension credits and help with housing benefit. Alternatively, members of the public can go to town centre shop on Welch Way where they can speak to staff in person. I have included the web links that residents can use to find out more information. Please can you pass this message onto anyone who you think might be eligible to claim pension credits and help with housing benefit.



Update on the Standing with Giants Story

To say it's been a surreal year is an understatement. years of incredibly hard work, with 87 different groups coming through the workshop to help assemble and paint the installation, led to our trip over to Normandy to install the display. The WI knitted an incredible 37,000 poppies for us. We're so very grateful to our regular volunteers, and it was wonderful to meet so many groups who helped paint, assemble, and pack the figures.

Leaving from Blenheim Palace with 270 Harley-Davidson riders , organised by Stanton Harcourt 's very own Alan Holland, and his Black Mountain HOG Chapter assisting us over the channel was the most memorable experience. Once installed at The British Normandy Memorial in France 200,000 people visited, including their majesties the King, the Queen, who we were formally introduced to ,the Prime Minister, and many heads of state from near and far. President Macron mentioned the silhouettes twice in his speech to the nation, and we were so very humbled to meet the Normandy veterans who travelled across the Channel for the 80th Anniversary events.

We have now removed the installation from France and reinstated it at the National Trust's Stowe Gardens in Buckinghamshire, which is already receiving tens of thousands of visitors weekly. They are also holding special early morning and twilight events to mark the occasion. Soon after the 11th of November, the installation will be dismantled and brought back to Stanton Harcourt for storage. We will work on maintenance over the winter.

We recently created an installation for the Ministry of Defence, now on display at Salisbury Plain, featuring some Stanton Harcourt models you may recognise. Normandy are very keen to see

our return. Sadly, as with most things, it's all down to finance. We are already being approached by interested parties regarding displaying back in the UK next year.

We came across this comment on Facebook, one of thousands, and it reads particularly well:

The <u>Standing with Giants</u> 'For Your Tomorrow' tribute at Stowe. Intensely emotional - breathtakingly powerful and poignantly beautiful. I used to try and hide my emotions, until I realised they're a strength, not a weakness, but I wasn't expecting the wave of emotion I felt from standing among the figures, each with their head bowed - I had an overwhelming need to touch them, to let them know they were not alone. But what really got me were the last letters home displayed on boards among them. The first one I read had me in tears, clearly written from a recent conflict it hit home hard. I've stood silently at too many dawn ramp ceremonies honouring the fallen on their last journey home and the memories came flooding back - never were the words 'For your Tomorrow' more apt. If you have the chance to visit, don't hesitate, it's a remarkable tribute.
