SHAPE (Stanton Harcourt

Action for Play & Enjoyment) is making good progress towards its aim of improving play areas in the village. We have visited the village school to talk to the children about our plans (the level of excitement was very high!) and the children have been working hard on designing playgrounds and completing worksheets for us. Demonstrating that we have engaged with our community will also be crucial to the success of our grant applications.

We would therefore like to invite everybody who is resident in Stanton Harcourt and Sutton to complete an **IMPORTANT SURVEY** regarding the provision of play areas in the village. This is relevant to everyone – whether you have children or grandchildren or neither; are supportive of SHAPE's aims or have concerns; and if this all sounds a bit familiar because you've been asked to complete a similar survey before, please help the new committee by doing this again as it is vital that we can present information which is up to date.

Ultra-Fast Broadband comes to Stanton Harcourt & Sutton

Having reached the target of 140 orders, Gigaclear have confirmed that they will be installing a new ultra-fast fibre optic broadband network across Stanton Harcourt & Sutton. It has taken over 12 months of hard work by the Broadband Committee and Gigaclear to reach the target.

Thanks to everyone that signed up so far to help deliver this fantastic community project. For those that have not signed up yet, Gigaclear will install an underground fibre connection point at every property they pass, not just those that sign up as customers, so it is never too late to sign up and benefit from broadband speeds that are as fast as any available anywhere in the world and will revolutionise your Internet, telephone and TV experiences.

What happens next?

Gigaclear are now finalising agreements with landowners and the Highways authority for the burying of the fibre optic cables that will supply the community, and expect to cross the Thames near Bablockhythe later this month to commence works. Gigaclear anticipate that all the many landowner agreements needed will be finalised over the next six to eight weeks but meanwhile are planning on starting the construction works in parts of the village in December. During November they will publish a schedule of works so that you will know where the contractors will be working and, more importantly, when they are likely to be outside your properties. Gigaclear expects the whole project to take three months from start to completion, so you should be online and enjoying ultrafast broadband from March-April 2014.

The Broadband Committee will remain in place for the moment to help support and facilitate the project and bring it to a successful conclusion. There will also be a number of village events as Gigaclear progress with the project, where there will be an opportunity to speak to the experts and try out the technology. Gigaclear representatives and members of the Broadband Group will also be present at the Village Market on November 2nd between 12 and 2pm. So, if you would like to learn more about the plan, Gigaclear's products and what the arrival of ultra-fast broadband will mean for the community then please pay us a visit. The next open day is in Appleton Village Hall on the 9th November, 09:30 – 16:30 so bring your laptop's, tablets etc. and try out the technology for yourself.

Don't Panic! Some may be aware that the Village Voice could not be delivered as usual last month due to objections raised by the Parish Council, who traditionally fund the printing and delivery of the newsletter.

While we have tried to carry on as usual it was not possible to distribute the October issue as we would have liked. You will have read above that the Parish Council welcome the opportunity to fund the newsletter. While this is obviously appreciated we are still in the process of finalising details.

This edition of the village voice has been funded by the editor as a good will gesture. If you would like to contribute to the cost of this issue then please make a donation in one of the piggy banks at the Pub or Shop. Small donations will be adequate as we have reduced the cost of production significantly and with any luck funding will return to normal in due course. We will report on funding in future issues.

It was good cycling weather - not hot, windy or rainy! I raised a total of £272, so thanks again to my sponsors!




