Traffic Signs

We have now received the two VAS signs which Volker Highways will be installing in the next few weeks. These long-awaited signs will alert drivers to slow down and keep to 20mph through the village. These signs alone may not be enough to slow traffic sufficiently; we are also working with OCC (Oxford County Council) to include painted chevrons and optical road narrowing in the resurfacing work of the B4449 that is being done during May.

Community Speedwatch

Tom Elliott-Frey has taken on organising the Community speed watch for Stanton Harcourt and Sutton. We've seen a noticeable increase in speeding through both Sutton and Stanton Harcourt and if you're concerned about road safety in our villages and want to make a positive impact, this is your chance to get involved. Volunteers will help monitor traffic speeds in key areas, working together to raise awareness and encourage safer driving. Monthly Report from West Oxford District Councillor Steve Cosier (SASH) Bablock Hythe – Response from Minister (DEFRA)

In February I wrote to Emma Hardy, the minister for the Department for Environmental Food and Rural Affairs, about the ongoing flooding issues in Bablock Hythe, and the push for better support for our community. I received a response from the Minister and wanted to share the key points.

The Minister acknowledged the serious impact the flooding had on residents and appreciated how difficult the situation had been. They stated that while landowners are responsible for maintaining watercourses, the Environment Agency (EA) carried out targeted maintenance in high-risk areas and operated a flood warning service to help communities prepare when flooding was likely. On the two key issues I raised, de-designating rivers and Streamlining EA permits, the Minister confirmed that the process was complex and there were no current plans to simplify it through legislation. On the issue of streamlining EA permits it was confirmed that restructuring has begun to deliver a more efficient permitting process for river maintenance. While some progress had been made. I remained firmly on the side of Bablock Hythe residents and all those affected by flooding in the area. I now have a meeting scheduled with the EA's Thames Area Flood Risk Manager in May to discuss how the EA can work with its partners and the local community to alleviate flood -risk. I will report back in due course.

Protecting Sutton A Campaign to Stop the HGVs By Stanton Harcourt Parish Council

Over the past year, residents of Sutton have been increasingly affected by a rise in heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) using the village as a shortcut to reach the Blackditch Trading Estate. As many of you will know firsthand, these vehicles are large, loud, and far too frequent for our narrow, rural roads.

At our last Parish Council meeting, we formally agreed to back a community-led campaign calling for a **7.5-tonne weight restriction**, with an exception for access (for example, deliveries, farms, and residents). This is a simple, sensible measure to help prevent Sutton becoming a freight corridor at the expense of safety and quality of life.

The issue is not just about traffic—it's about people. With no pavements in places, our roads are used daily by children walking to school, dog walkers, cyclists, and those simply trying to enjoy village life. The rise in HGV traffic has created a real and growing risk.

In response, we have launched a **public petition** to demonstrate local support for action, which you can sign online:

Flyers with a scannable QR code will also be placed on noticeboards and through letterboxes.

We are also preparing campaign packs, letters to councillors, and gathering evidence to present to Oxfordshire County Council and West Oxfordshire District Council.
