Parish Council News Roof Insulation

Since the last edition of the Village Voice, I am pleased to inform you that The Old Guard Room has now had its roof fully insulated. Absolute Solar completed the work a few weeks ago, and now we have a warmer room for residents to use.

Planning Application

A planning application has been submitted in Blackditch for the erection of seven dwellings with associated works to include new access road, carports, parking bays and soft and hard landscaping.

The parish council has objected strongly to the scheme on the following grounds: environmental impact, traffic and transportation impact, increased noise levels and pollution, the effect on the character and appearance of the area, sustainability, and the impact on local amenities and services. The parish council has urged the planning authority to refuse the application.

Monthly Report from West Oxford District Councillor Steve Cosier (SASH)

In January I attended WODC's Lowland Planning Committee and spoke on behalf of residents living on The Old Airfield to ensure that Hayfield and any future management company maintain and enhance biodiversity and ensure long-term management in perpetuity.

After two years Hayfields finally submitted amended soft-landscaping plans. Thanks to the support and patience of residents, I was able to ensure that approved remedial works will be carried out under the strict supervision of a professional ecologist. These works include integrating Bat roosting features and bird nesting opportunities, as well as, making sure that if any trees or shrubs planted as part of the landscaping die or are seriously damaged or destroyed within 5 years of completion, they will be replaced with equivalent species and properly maintained. Also, a hedgerow will be finally planted along the southern edge of the site to the adjacent cricket ground, and it was agreed that the wildflower meadow areas could be cut more regularly for the next 2 years or so to help them to re-establish.

I will of course be monitoring the soft landscaping situation, as The Old Airfield site has much to offer for all residents of Sutton, and Stanton Harcourt, and will make sure Hayfields and the planner adhere to the new planning permission.

Noise: D&M plant hire Ltd - Dix Pits

Residents might have heard some loud thumping recently coming from the direction of Dix Pits. The noise was the breaking up of concreate by D&M Plant hire. Residents contacted me in Stanton Harcourt and Northmoor about the noise, and I duly spoke to WODC's principal planner. The company has a license to recycle aggregate and soils, but operation compliance falls under OCC. I contact OCC Councillor Dan Levy on resident's behalf and as I write the excess noise has stopped. However, I will be listening out for any future noise disturbance and will act accordingly if it resumes.

County Council Update from Councillor Dan Levy Local Government reorganisation

The government has decided that local government will be reorganised. There will be a Mayoral Combined Authority, with responsibilities in areas like public transport and inward investment. It is likely to cover roughly the same area as Thames Valley Police.

There will be an end to two tier areas. So WODC and Oxfordshire County Council will disappear. There will be one or more unitary authorities fulfilling all council matters, including planning, bins, adult social care, children's services and highways.

The government has said that these new councils should have at least 500,000 residents each. The most sensible thing would be to have a single Oxfordshire unitary authority. That would avoid having to split up complicated and critical services like social services.

Oxford City Council has declared that it wants Oxfordshire to be split into an inner core and outer ring, with the central Oxford authority being Oxford and part of each of the surrounding districts. This would have to extend at least as far as Witney. We need to put initial proposals to government

by the end of March, and final ones by the end of November, with an expected start date of May 2027.

Council elections will take place on May 1 this year. They will be under the new boundaries established by the Electoral Commission. I will be standing for the Eynsham Division, which includes Stanton Harcourt.

Budget

The County Council passed its budget on 11 February. The budget is balanced, prudent and also ambitious. Among other measures were £60m for roads maintenance, £4m in flood measures, and the restoration of annual gulley cleaning which was reduced to once every 4 years by the previous administration.

There is additional money for early intervention and support for under 5s, for SEND provision, as well as money for enhancing market towns including Witney, and for active travel in rural areas.

You will start to see road conditions being fixed, as the weather improves, starting with the major roads.



Our hedgehogs will be waking up this month With the unpredictable weather, their hibernation patterns are less certain but usually they won't go back into hibernation now until the winter. This means they will be hungry and thirsty after a long dormant period and will need to build their fat reserves and energy ready for the breeding season.

- You can put out meat-based cat food for hedgehogs (with meat not fish). Go Cat dried cat biscuits are recommended as an easy option by the Kirtlington Hedgehog Highway group.
 - Put out the food at dusk and remove any that's left the following morning
- so it doesn't go bad
- You can use a hedgehog feeding station to prevent cats from eating all the food. These include a right angle that the hedgehog has to use as they can bend at this angle easily whereas a cat cannot.
- Put out shallow water dishes or accessible ponds for hedgehogs to drink
- Natural food sources come from our slugs, snails and other invertebrates. Do not use slug pellets or insecticides as these will also harm hedgehogs that eat the infected 'pests'.
- Rats? I had rats come into my garden, so I didn't put out hedgehog food. I had to rely on the invertebrates to feed the hedgehogs. Fortunately, I had a hedgehog forage in my lettuce patch most nights and I ended up with very healthy, pest-free lettuce!
