### STANTON HARCOURT & SUTTON PARISH COUNCIL

First meeting of the new Parish Council, Monday 1st July.

#### From Steve Cosier, District Council

West Oxford District Council recently joined the Thames Valley Police CCTV Partnership to upgrade CCTV provision in WODC owned public spaces. West Oxfordshire District Council owns and operates a public open space CCTV system in the district, consisting of 63 cameras. The upgrading covers the economic wellbeing of public spaces and the prevention of disorder or crime, but most importantly it is aimed at reducing violence against women and girls.

As the local ward member, I have asked that the Planning Department to review Green open spaces and protection of community assets in the district. At the present time there are many facilities and open spaces which are not being maintained by developers. I have asked officers to look at how the council might be able to adopt and maintain community and green spaces in the future. They have been asked to look at taking over the legal cost of liabilities and amending 106s agreements. Officers are now looking at ideas to see how they might consider adoption of community assets and take better care of our green spaces.

Recently, I asked the County's Highways Agreement Engineers to look at the highway drains on the Old Airfield development. Many of the drains and gullies are blocked with cement and debris. Officers have confirmed that the drains need to be cleared and Hayfield must undertake the clearing work before they will adopt the roads. County officers are now pursuing Hayfield to take corrective action.

And lastly, it is my great pleasure to congratulate our newly elected parish councillors; James Coleman, Sandra Cosier, Keith Hickson, Ellen Judson and Geoff Webster. I am really looking forward to working with them as the District Councillor for SASH.


