Parish Council News

Protecting Our Village

Parish Councillor Geoff Webster has recently set up Protect Sutton Village: Say YES to a 7.5-Tonne Weight Limit campaign. Geoff is calling for a 7.5-tonne weight limit (except for access) to stop heavy lorries from using Sutton's narrow village roads as a shortcut. Sutton is characterized by its narrow roads, absence of pavements in certain areas, and tight bends, with homes situated feet from the B449. In recent months, there has been a noticeable increase in heavy goods vehicle (HGV) traffic, as drivers use Sutton as a shortcut to access the Stanton Harcourt Trading Estate, Civica, and other industrial sites, including The Sheehan Group. This surge in HGV traffic has had a significant impact on both Sutton and Stanton Harcourt residents, with an alarming rise in near-miss incidents involving these large vehicles. This increased traffic raises concerns about safety, particularly for children, elderly residents, and cyclists, who are more vulnerable on these roads. Additionally, the heavy vehicles contribute to road damage and impact heavily on Sutton. The Parish Council fully support local deliveries and essential access, but we feel that Sutton should not serve as a primary freight route. A practical solution is the introduction of a 7.5tonne limit on the B4449, allowing access for farms, deliveries,

and residents while reducing unnecessary industrial traffic through the village.

If you agree, please consider adding your name to the petition to help implement this change.

District Councillor's Meeting with Police and Crime Commissioner:

In May we met with the Police and Crime Commissioner to discuss local concerns, about speeding and road safety. One of the issues that we have asked the PPC to look at is how Thames Valley Police use traffic data supplied by Speedwatch Teams. We have asked for some clarity on who receives the data, how it is used in enforcement and whether parishes can access that information. The issue of closer collaboration with Parish councils was raised. The PCC is going to engage with Norfolk Constabulary, who have a good record of partnership with Parish Councils. It is hoped that the PCC can learn about their best practices, with the aim of strengthen collaboration between local police and communities in the ward.

To keep parishes informed, we have asked the Police and Crime Commissioner to make sure that all Parish Councils in the ward receive timely updates regarding speeding and enforcement. Information will be shared with all Parish Councils, providing clarity on ongoing measures to address road safety concerns. A new Dedicated Road Safety and Speeding Team is being created by Thames Valley Police. This team will work in partnership with Community Speedwatch groups. It is hoped that this will help local communities play a key role in tackling speeding issues.

We remain committed to addressing resident concerns about speeding and road safety and will be meeting the PCC in the future to ensure that resident's concerns are taken seriously. In the meantime, if you have any questions relating to this, please contact me: sandra.cosier@westoxon.qov.uk

Monthly Report from West Oxford District From Councillor Steve Cosier (SASH) Report on the Future Role of Parish Councils:

As West Oxfordshire moves towards a unitary authority, I have written to the Minister of State for Local Government and English Devolution, Jim McMahon, to clarify how parish councils in my ward will be supported and included in this new structure. Acting on behalf of the Parish Councils, I am pressing for clear commitments to protect local democracy and community governance.

Parish Councils are essential for delivering essential local services, maintaining assets, and ensuring that residents' voices are heard in planning decisions. Their unique ability to respond to local needs must not be compromised in any transition.

To safeguard their role, I have asked Mr McMahon to confirm what specific measures the Parish Council will have, including how they will work within the new unitary authority, what financial and structural support they will receive, and how their statutory consultation rights in planning matters will be protected. I will continue to press the Minister for definitive answers to ensure that Stanton Harcourt and Sutton and other parish councils in my ward remain central to local decision-making. Their work is fundamental to maintaining community identity and ensuring residents are well- represented in any new authority. I look forward to receiving a clear response from the Minister on these pressing concerns and will keep you updated. Best wishes Steve


